STATE BOARD OF MEDICINE TAKES DISCIPLINARY ACTION

BOSTON: At its meeting today the state Board of Registration in Medicine took disciplinary action against the medical licenses of Henri Lamothe, M.D., and Thomas David Gill, M.D.

The Board reprimanded Dr. Henri Lamothe and fined him \$5,000. The Board found that Dr. Lamothe failed to report two malpractice claims on his license renewal applications. Dr. Lamothe is a 1986 graduate of the University of Connecticut School of Medicine. His specialty is Internal Medicine, and he was first licensed to practice in Massachusetts in 1988. He currently practices in New York.

In another matter, the Board accepted the resignation of Dr. Thomas Gill's license to practice medicine. Resignation is a disciplinary action that permanently removes a physician from practice. Dr. Gill is a 1969 graduate of the University of Arkansas College of Medicine. He is board certified in Pediatrics, and has been licensed to practice medicine in Massachusetts since 1971.

The Massachusetts Board of Registration in Medicine licenses more than 32,000 physicians, osteopaths and acupuncturists. The Board was created in 1894 to protect the public health and safety by setting standards for the practice of medicine and ensuring that doctors who practice in the Commonwealth are appropriately qualified and competent. The Board investigates complaints, holds hearings and determines sanctions. More information is available at www.massmedboard.org.
